# Patient Navigators/Community Health Workers

- \* Community health workers (CHWs) and Patient Navigators help to connect patients to various community resources and assist with closing the loop on referrals, while helping patients better navigate the healthcare system
- \* Key Roles:
  - \* Identify and address health challenges within the community/population.
  - \* Opportunities to integrate into clinical workflows for patient/population support.

# The Benefits to Healthcare Providers

- \* CHWs and patient navigators provide many benefits to healthcare providers including:
  - \* Building trusting relationships with patients.
  - \* Strengthen overall care coordination.
  - \* Secure or strengthen relationships with community partners.
  - \* Provide support around referrals and follow up.
  - \* Assist with patient navigation of their healthcare needs.
- \* SHIP Partnership/Role:
  - \* Establishing a role/position within public health or healthcare for CHW/patient navigator.
  - \* Providing training opportunities to those interested in becoming a certified CHW.
  - \* CHW/navigator to incorporate SDOH screening on site for patients- ex. Housing instability, Food insecurity, Transportation problems, Utility help needs, etc.
  - \* Connecting patients to community-based resources/assisting with referrals (ex. food shelves, community gardens, farmers markets, parks access, etc.).
  - \* CHWs assist/enroll patients to Healthy Lifestyle Change Programs (i.e. Food Rx, Park Rx, Exercise is Medicine).
  - \* Opportunities to be trained in Evidence-based Programs or Social Determinants of Health..
  - \* Facilitate communications with patients and providers to assist with navigating the healthcare system.



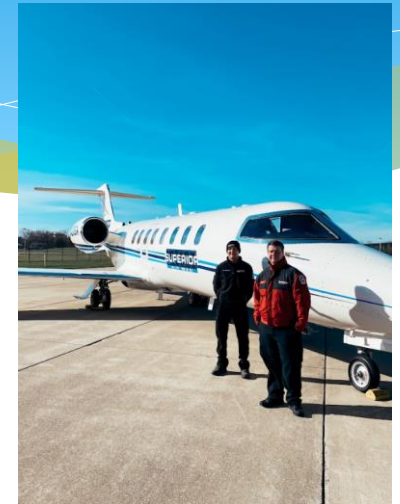
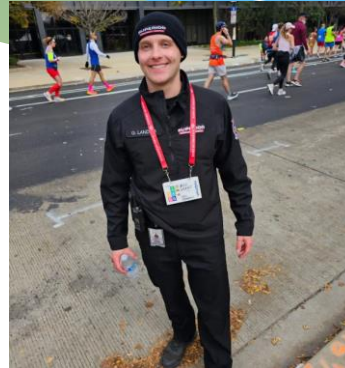

- \* EMS: Emergency Medical Services
- \* BLS: Basic Life Support
- \* ALS: Advanced Life Support
- \* EMR: Emergency Medical Responder- entry level EMS certification
- \* EMT: Emergency Medical Technician- mid level EMS certification
- \* Paramedic- highest level EMS certification
- \* CP: Community Paramedicine

# Jackson Ambulance History

- \* Jackson Ambulance Service operated as a volunteer ambulance service.
- \* Then a combined service of volunteers and PT staff.
- \* Then, a combined service of volunteers, PT staff, and FT administration
- \* BLS care for 911 and transfers
- \* Currently BLS care for 911 and ALS care for transfers
- \* Estimated December 2024 ALS care for 911 and transfers

# Community Focused Care

- \* Minnesota is one of only 14 states to provide Medicaid reimbursement
- \* Minnesota allows for reimbursement from private insurers
- \* Education and licensure for both EMTs and Paramedics
- \* Community EMS program launch by December 2025 with Community EMTs
- \* Addition of Community Paramedics by June 2026
- \* Looking for opportunities to provide services sooner


